DEPARTMENT NEWS



Head of Sound Design Professor **Shahrokh Yadegari** will be presenting a MAE Departmental 'Mechanics and Materials' Seminar on Monday, February 1st, in 479 Engineering Building II from 11:00am - 12:00pm. The title of his seminar is "*Using self-similarity and nonlinear dynamic for composition of sound and music.*" From Sharokh: "Prior to the 20th Century, sound and music were commonly understood to play distinct artistic and technical roles; however, theoretically the physical structures of sound played an intimate role in defining the artistic language of music. With the introduction of electronics and computers in music production, their relationship conceptually and

artistically has become even more intimate than before. Accepting a relationship between the two, while also assuming that one organizes the other, implies a self-referential structure. In this presentation, I will introduce the artistic and technical elements of my compositional language and the tools I have devised for sound/music synthesis based on the concepts of self-similarity. I shall also briefly discuss the role of metaphysics and self-similarity in poetry of Omar Khayyam, the 10th century Persian mathematician and poet, and how I have used such concepts in designing my Recursive Granular Synthesis method. An application of non-linear differential equations for sound and music synthesis will also be presented." The public is welcome to attend. 
