FACULTY AND STAFF NEWS

Shuttle Service for the holidays - Campus Loop shuttles will not be in service from December 14th until the start of the Winter Quarter. The Coaster, Hillcrest/Campus, Hillcrest/Old Town, and Torrey Pines Center shuttles will maintain their normal schedules until December 21st, when most shuttle service will be discontinued until January 1st. Library Materials Cuts [from Brian E. C. Schottlaender, Audrey Geisel University Librarian] - "Over the last two fiscal years, 2008/2009 and 2009/2010, the UC San Diego Libraries have had to cut permanently our collections budget by more than \$500,000 (8%). Further, we have had an additional one-time cut of very nearly another \$500,000 this year). We anticipate that fiscal year 2010/2011 will present additional financial challenges for us. This year, we are realizing savings through a number of strategies that are outlined on the December 2009 Budget Update Collections web page. At the UC Systemwide level, the California Digital Library (CDL) is working with our vendors in an effort to avoid annual price increases and, in some instances, attempting to bring prices down. The University Librarians of the UC Libraries have requested that, over the next two years, the CDL reduce Systemwide expenditures for electronic journal licenses by 15%. CDL is currently in licensing negotiations with two of our major providers, who between them supply UC with more than 2,600 electronic journals. The goal of the CDL's negotiations is to realize savings with no loss of content. However, if that is not possible, the CDL and the UC Libraries are prepared to cut content, specifically targeting titles with the highest cost and the lowest use.
