
**February 1<sup>st</sup> Paycheck Advice** is available at At Your Service Online now. If you are an employee transitioning from monthly to bi-weekly pay dates, this check will be for part of the month of January (about 60%). The full benefit amount for February will be deducted from this check. Your other deductions (403B, UCRP, FSA, etc.) should be coming off this check at the prorated amount. Your next paycheck should arrive on February 13<sup>th</sup>. It will be for your pay for the last part of January and will have a pro-rated deduction for your benefits for the month of March

(as will your February 27<sup>th</sup> paycheck). Click here for a <u>paydate calendar</u>. Note that if you signed up for the TAP, the funds should appear on your February 1 paycheck. Check your pay advice carefully for errors!

**W-2s Available** – If you elected to receive your W-2 electronically, you should have received an email last week telling you that it was available to download from At Your Service Online. W-2s for employees who did not select this option should be available in the next few weeks. If you wish to subscribe to the online access for next year's W-2, go to At Your Service Online, click on the Income and Taxes tab, and follow the instructions provided there.

**Heads-Up! Health Plan Shakeups Possible** - UC is putting all current medical plans out to bid (except for Kaiser and Western Health Advantage) for 2014 and is accepting bids from new vendors. At this point, only Kaiser and WHA are sure to be offered next year.
