The Power of Duff at the Geffen Playhouse




Check out **2013 MFA Acting Alum Maurice Williams** in *The Power of Duff* at The Geffen Playhouse in Los Angeles, California.

See **1990 MFA Acting Alum Tom Nelis** on Broadway with Chita Rivera in Kander & Ebb's *The Visit*.


