GRADWORKS THE IMPLICIT SELF OPENS THIS WEEKEND

MFA Dance Student Verónica Santiago Moniello's second year project *The Implicit Self* performs this weekend at Dance Studio 3 in the Wagner Dance Building. The show performs April 20-22nd and explores different ways of "rebirth" and is a collaboration with composer Annie Hui-Hsin Hsieh to experiment scenic situations by building sound scores to live actions. The Implicit Self is an ongoing process of experimentation based on Moniello's last research "The Origin of an Implicit Body Language" which was developed during the summer of 2016 in Venezuela. This process was supported by CILAS, Center for Latin American & Caribbean Studies, and Fundación Andróginos from Mérida, Venezuela.

MARIANNE MCDONALD HONORED BY ARION JOURNAL OF HUMANITIES AND CLASSICS


Distinguished Professor of Theatre and Classics Marianne


