Marcos Duran is currently a Lecturer at UC San Diego and a member of San Diego Dance Theater. His work *Minced* was recently accepted as an official selection for the Los Angeles 2021 Experimental, Dance, and Music Film Festival. He holds an MFA in Dance from UC San Diego.

A New Yorker from 2008-2017, he directed and performed in Marcos Duran Performance Group. He was invited to share his work at Movement Research at The Judson Church, Dixon Place, La MaMa Experimental Theater, Theater for the New City, 92nd St Y, and Center for Performance Research. While a graduate at UC San Diego from 2017-2020, he made three works that culminated 15 years as a dancemaker. *Heel, Skull* (60 min), *The Rules of the Game* (25 min), and his thesis work, *The Underground* (95 min), all premiered at La Jolla Playhouse theater district. They exhibited accounts of social choreography, CranioSacral audience integration, and transdisciplinary collaboration between visual arts, music, technology, and theater.
