SUMMARY

A silly little alien comes to earth on a desperate mission to capture love in a ziplock bag - only to discover the Costa-Mesa Walk-In Clinic and the U.S. healthcare system. This is a goofy-woofy adventure about having a body and longing for connection, in a sinister world where both things are dangerous.

A Note from the Dramaturg

Just as the development of a new play is always changing, the world of *I Found a Zipper* is also constantly morphing and asking new questions. Beginning with the first staged reading in December, the rehearsal process for this play has been all about discovery. *I Found a Zipper* is a combination of joy and grief that deeply speaks to our dour feelings of loneliness and how to overcome them by finding genuine connection and understanding with others. At its core, this play is about searching for love in a world where so many have given up on trying to find it.

What has been useful in thinking about this play from a dramaturgical standpoint has not been just traditional research, but also true stories about common human emotions like love and grief, or phobias of mundane activities like going to the doctor. In curating my dramaturgy packet for the actors and the production team, I gathered a wide range of personal testimonials that were sparked by the longing for human connection, including poems and internet chat threads. While these methods of expression differ greatly, there lies a commonality in their intention - to conquer the feeling of loneliness by finding love.

Whether at Alien High Command or later at the Costa Mesa Walk-in Clinic, in *I Found a Zipper*, love takes on many forms and meanings. What does love mean and can it be defined? What is the true power of love, and how powerful is it? Love could have the ability to power every spaceship in the galaxy and we don't even know it. The play is confusing at times, and rightly so, as the journey of coming to terms with emotions is often a convoluted and non-linear struggle. But the struggle ends with love. Throughout *I Found A Zipper*, we are reminded that the human capacity for love is infinite so long as we cherish it, foster it, and not take it for granted.

THE PLAYWRIGHT

Milo Cramer (Playwright) (they/he) is a second-year MFA candidate. Milo's solo musical *School Pictures* premiered at The Wilma in Philadelphia ("Charming from start to finish...beautifully heartbreaking" -Talkin' Broadway), and is upcoming at Playwrights Horizons. THE DIRECTOR

Kim Rubinstein Before coming to UC San Diego (where she is now retired) to teach acting and directing, Kim Rubinstein was the Long Wharf Theatre's Associate Artistic Director. Her productions have received numerous awards, most recently at Los Angeles' Odyssey Theatre for her productions of *Anna Christie* and *A Taste of Honey*.

Recent UCSD at La Jolla Playhouse productions include *A Raisin in the Sun*, *How to Defend Yourself* and *Streamers*. Professor Rubinstein's other teaching credits include ten years on the acting/directing faculty at Northwestern University, as well as adjunct at University of Chicago, Brown/Trinity Consortium, Wesleyan University, NTI at The O'Neill Center and an ongoing teaching gig with the School at Steppenwolf.

Professor Rubinstein has developed a systematic, embodied training synthesizing neuroscience with theatre techniques that stimulates and expands optimal creative thinking for people in all fields of endeavor. She has created and taught classes at UC San Diego called "Cultivating the Creative Mind", and has devised and taught a series of workshops on communicating research for faculty, post-docs and graduate students through the the Biology and Physical Science departments and the Graduate Division. She is also part of the Center for Empathy and Compassion's Sanford Fellowship, which trains doctors to communicate effectively with their patients.
